GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Entries in all classes may be entered Friday afternoon from 3-5 pm or Saturday morning from 8 am to 11 a.m.
2. Exhibitors are limited to two entries per subject, except genealogy where only one entry per subject. **Enter only items made since the last two years.**
3. Entries cannot be exhibited in the “not specified” subject area, if there is a specified subject for the item.
4. Pre-entry forms are available in the back of the fair book or at the Extension office. The forms may be turned in to the Extension office after July 1st until Thursday 23rd. Tags will be computer printed, available to pick up Friday afternoon or Saturday morning from entry clerks in the exhibit building-if the forms are brought in by 3:30 pm Thursday prior to the fair. Judging will be Saturday at 1.00 p.m.
5. No exhibitor shall remove an exhibit until Monday of the show without permission from the Fair Association Rep. Exhibits will be released from **5pm to 6pm**. Premium money will be distributed when the entry is picked up. Any perishable exhibits left after 6 Monday will be disposed of unless other arrangements have been made.
6. Exhibits on the fairgrounds are not insured by the Fair Association for fire, explosion, smoke damage, weather, theft, vandalism, or any other loss or expense. Participants exhibit at their own risk.
7. Articles winning a first premium at previous Lucas County Fair cannot be exhibited again
8. A disputed question will be decided by the superintendent in charge, and if appealed, the decision will be made on entry day.
9. A false statement made by the exhibitor in regard to an entry or an attempt to interfere with the judges in performance of their duty, shall exclude exhibitors from exhibiting on the grounds of the association. The length of this exclusion will be determined by the fair board up to and including expulsion. (It is requested that no unnecessary talking with the judge be allowed during judging.)
10. A Best of Show ribbon will be awarded in each department (adult & youth). (There is no cash premiums for Best of Show)
11. Ribbon awarded in each class will be: One-blue, one-red and one white ribbon.
12. Ribbons and Premiums may be donated back to the Fair Association by winners, if desired. A check must be a minimum of \$5.00 before a check will be issued.
13. Special needs individuals may exhibit in any class. Exhibitors need to be identified when entering in their class (adult & youth)
14. Hours of the Open Class Building to be open are Friday from 3-5 pm. Saturday from 8 A.M.-8 P.M. Sunday from 9 A.M. to 8 P.M., **Monday from 9 A.M.-5 P.M. with Exhibits being RELEASED 5 P.M. to 6 P.M.**
